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
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Compression choice

Hosiery that looks just like a regular sock is now available in a variety of colours such as black, blue and brown to suit your wardrobe. Some garments even have patterns, just like a pair of socks, so when you flash the fabric while out and about, you may feel less conscious about wearing this style of hosiery.

A tight to remember

Compression tights are also available that use a light fabric with a range of multiple patterns that look like a low denier tight. If opaque is for you, thicker garments are also available that look like tights or leggings, but definitely not like traditional hosiery!
